

Evaluations of fields of study 2019

- A "thematic evaluation" on the development of the educational profile / educational offering of HEI's
 - Field-specific focus on social sciences, humanities, technology and business/economics.
 - The central topics covered in the evaluation are the competencebase and working-life relevance of degrees.
 - The evaluation also produces information on the strengths and development needs of HEIs and the entire higher education system in terms of their ability to respond to the changing competence needs and future operational environment.



Methods – combining quantitiative and qualitative evaluation

1. Step: The "Big picture"

HEI Self – evaluation

2. Step: Enhancing the analysis


3. Step: Final development
